Students receive an instructional permit after successful completion of the course with a grade of 80 percent or better. Total hours of instruction is 40; 30 classroom and 10 driving. COVER ARTIST: PENNY HARTWELL



Penny started taking classes at a stained glass studio and adult education program in Rhode Island in 1977. When she moved to Maine in 1981, she began sharing her love of creating with stained glass work and started teaching stained glass classes at adult education programs in the area. Penny cultivated her stained glass style through her love of English gardens, woods, and coastal Maine.

In recent years, Penny has added acid etching, silver clay jewelry with enamel color accents, painting with powdered glass, and fusing to her repertoire of skills and classes.

Many pieces she creates incorporate locally sourced sea glass, rocks, fossils, and pottery shards for an added dimension. According to Penny, stained glass was more challenging 40 years ago, but with the advanced tools and products available, the medium has become less difficult.

The tools are more advanced, making cutting glass easier. The amazing array of glass colors, textures, and other great glass products helps provide glass artists with excellent opportunities to create unique and interesting art glass pieces.







SILVER JEWELRY MAKING

Working with Silver Clay is an exciting process where the inexperienced can explore their artistic abilities and create unique one of a kind items. Come join this exciting class where beginners can easily learn to create earrings, pendants, charms, beads, bracelets, and rings. BEGINNING WATERCOLOR

Learn which papers, materials, and brushes work best for you as we go over the basics of traditional and contemporary watercolor ideas and techniques. Class work will be a combination of watercolor exercises, whereby we learn the behavior of and particularities of watercolor through exercises. We will then apply this knowledge to small set ups so that we can gain some practical application. I will spend some time going over basic drawing ideas, color theory, color mixing, and brush care. A willingness to draw, and/or improve upon drawing skills will enhance your experience in this class. Absolute beginners in both drawing and watercolor need to recognize that they are attempting two new skills: drawing and watercolor.
